Fr Tony writes:

This week our eyes are turned to France, and I am not just talking about the Olympics! Rather I am thinking of the 700+ people from the diocese, old and young, sick and healthy, able bodied and those with impairments, helpers, chaplains, nurses, doctors and 'VIPs', first timers and veterans, who are gathered in Lourdes for the diocesan pilgrimage at this time. Some of these will have made 'Olympian' efforts to get to Lourdes, supported by friends, family, and parishes across the diocese. Our prayers are with them, and we know they will be praying for us.





The Olympics themselves remind us just what human beings can achieve if they commit themselves wholeheartedly to a goal. And while PARIS 2024 those achievements are built on God-given talents, without the effort those talents would not bear any fruit.

Now we know the vast majority of people could not run 100 meters in under 10.5 seconds or hop, skip and jump 18 meters, however hard they tried. But we all have gifts and talents, and are called to make use of them. Perhaps we feel like Philip in the Gospel, our 'five loaves and two fish' seem so inadequate. But, the Lord blesses our little offerings and makes them more than adequate for the tasks to which he calls us.



CCRS – South – beginning Tuesday 24 September 2024

The Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies, will be run at Cardinal Newman School in Hove on Tuesdays from 3:45-5:45pm. Each module (5 sessions) will be delivered over a term and the course of 8 modules will complete in 2 academic years. The first module, starting in September, is on the Old Testament. There is a £20 registration fee for the course, and £30 is charged for each module. This may be paid by the student, or they may be sponsored by their school/parish.
