Canon David Writes:

Supported by your prayers, the clergy of Brighton & Hove Deanery met on the 11th February to look at the steps needed to establish the new parish of Brighton & Hove, as Bishop Richard set out in the Diocesan Pastoral Plan. When we meet again on 26th February, we will be considering how to form a leadership team of clergy and lay people. This team will work with us forming the new parish through consultation with parishioners about its mission and how that mission will be carried out in each of our communities. When the basic elements of parish leadership are in place and the consultation has been carried out, we will ask the Bishop to inaugurate the new parish. I will be the Moderator of the parish clergy bringing them together to act in a collaborative manner in dialogue with the leadership team and, through them, parishioners in each of our communities. There is much to be done and the clergy are looking forward to working with you to renew the Catholic faith in our City. As prayer will be the foundation of this new endeavour, please keep the formation of the new parish in the forefront of your intentions.

Cash4Coins SVP The SVP would like to raise more funds to support some of our projects and one way we can do so is by asking people to donate their leftover, old coins, or holiday currency to the SVP. Cardinal Nichols slams "deeply irresponsible" assisted suicide bill

Cardinal Nichols, President of the Bishops' Conference and Archbishop of Westminster, has called the way in which the assisted suicide bill is being handled "deeply irresponsible" and a "shambles". Speaking to Christian Fellowship, a group at News UK, the Cardinal expressed serious concern that MPs had only spent a few hours debating assisted suicide, when they spent more than a hundred times longer debating banning fox hunting in 2004. He said: "I believe it is deeply irresponsible of any government to allow a change of this magnitude to be carried out without due, proper, government-supported parliamentary process". He added: "I think what's happening, if it came to pass, would be the biggest change that this country has seen for many, many decades at least, probably more. On the back of what five, six, seven hours' debate? "I was told that the fox hunting bill [in 2004] endured 700 hours of debate." Cardinal Nichols added that there was "something deeply lacking in a government that isn't prepared to guide and sponsor, if it wants to, this process of legal change". In October last year, Cardinal Nichols issued a pastoral letter to his diocese, encouraging Catholics to contact their MPs ahead of the debate. In it, he raised concerns "the right to die can become a duty to die". He said: "Once assisted suicide is approved by the law, a key protection of human life falls away. Pressure mounts on those who are nearing death, from others or even from themselves, to end their life in order to take away a perceived burden of care from their family, for the avoidance of pain, or for the sake of an inheritance". He added: "The radical change in the law now being proposed risks bringing about for all medical professionals a slow change from a duty to care to a duty to kill."
