Fr Tony Writes

Why do we pray for the dead? We often speak of those who have died as 'being with God'. If that is the case why do we need to pray for them. Surely they should be praying for us! Well in fact, they can and do pray for us.

Perhaps the most basic reason we pray for them is because we need to. We feel the deep desire to commend our loved ones to the Lord. But it also connects with our understanding of purgatory. Purgatory gets a bad press at times, not least because of some rather bleak presentations of it by some Catholics. But it's name means 'purification'. Very few of us are perfect when we die. Most of us have attachments to things that are sinful in some way or other. We have a bit of an addiction to sin! To be fully united with God we have to be freed from that addiction.

Breaking an addiction can be a painful process, but it is made much easier if we have the support of friends and family. Perhaps we can see purgatory as a rehab clinic, with Jesus as the doctor who is lovingly healing us from our addiction, even though that process is painful for us. And our family and friends are supporting us with their prayers, making it so much easier for us. One big difference, however. There is no relapsing in heaven!
