Fr Tony Writes:

On this final Sunday of Advent our attention is drawn to Mary. But this year we don't hear about the announcement of Jesus birth (the 'Annunciation') rather we here about the story that comes immediately after: the Visitation. It is a story filled with joy, a joy which I think is beautifully captured in this



image. That joy is also expressed in the Magnificat, which follows the story from Luke that we hear in todays Gospel. Mary sings, "the Almighty has done 5 great things for me". Yet, at this point there was a great deal of uncertainty. We know that things did not exactly go smoothly for the Holy Family! Being able to rejoice in God's gifts, even when we face challenges and difficulties is something we can learn from Mary as we prepare to celebrate Christmas.

I hope you all have a joyful and faith-filled Christmas, but if Christmas is going to be tough for you this year, remember that it was not easy for the Holy Family either, and yet that note of joy is always present. May the joy of the Hoy Family warm your hearts this Christmas.

Taking a Break

Depression has been part of my life for some years now. Generally it has been in the background, but in the last couple of years it has been a bit more challenging at times. The recent death of my father has made it yet more challenging. Up to now I have been managing it 'on the job', as it were, with the support of both the diocese and of others. But that is not really working at present. So, after discussion with Bishop Richard, I will be taking a break from parish ministry.

The details are still being worked out, but the break will start after the Epiphany (This year on Sunday 5th January) and probably last until Autumn next year. The house here in Mile Oak will continue to be my base. And when I return to pastoral ministry I hope to continue as part of the team serving the new parish of Brighton and Hove, with particular responsibility for St George's and St Theresa's. While I am away, Fr David at St Peter's will have 1 pastoral oversight, and Masses will be covered by priests of the deanery.

I know you will keep me in your prayers. I will keep you in mine.

Update on our New Parish

Bishop Richard invited us all, in his Pastoral Plan: The Call to Mission, to help build strong, lively, and welcoming schools of discipleship. Against the pillars of Prayer, Formation and Mission he called for the Brighton & Hove Deanery to make its transition to a new parish led by a team of clergy with a moderator from January 2025. The local clergy and laity began meeting to prepare some 18 months ago, and plans have progressed since Canon David Parmiter was named as our future moderator in the summer. As well as being Parish Priest of St Peter's, he is designated to become Moderator of the new parish serving Brighton & Hove. The next stage begins when the Deanery clergy meet on 11th February

2025 to discuss and establish the processes and decision-making bodies that the new parish will need to run. Once the bishop gives his assent to the plans, he will hold a celebration during the first quarter of 2025 for the Inauguration of the new Parish and the Installation of Canon David as its Parish Priest. Although the teams behind the scenes may change shape in the months following, we expect the communities in the existing parishes will continue to operate just as they do now, until personnel changes or operating improvements require otherwise.


