Fr Tony Writes

Clocks going back this weekend reminds us that we are well into Autumn. The leaves on the trees tell the same story. People around are buying pumpkins and fireworks. It may seem that Halloween and Bonfire night are relatively recent inventions. But Halloween predates the Americanised commercial festival by a great deal. And the origins of Bonfire Night predate Guy Fawkes.

The name 'Halloween' is a contraction of 'All Hallows Eve', that is, the eve of All Saints. All the stuff with 'ghoulies and ghosties' etc. has its origins in the idea that these forces of evil are driven away by the holiness of the saints. Any dressing up etc that went with these was not to scare people, but instead to 'bring them into the light', showing that these things have no



power over Christ and the Church. Tracing the history is difficult, as there were probably various reasons why we came to celebrate All Saints at this time, but it seems clear that it was at least in part a Christian demonstration, through the lives of the saints, that the power of God's love overcomes malicious forces including any recalled with fear in some previous pagan festival.

Indeed, along with the bonfires, it seems to be linked to the pre-Christian feast of Samhain, which involved the lighting of fires as we approach the darkness of winter. Many of us still enjoy a bonfire celebration and fireworks, some warmth and brightness as winter approaches, without necessarily knowing (or worrying) about the origins of these events. If you do join in such celebrations, do remember that it is Christ who is the true light, banishing the forces of darkness.

Saturday is All Souls Day, and that marks the beginning of a month in which we pray for the dead. The envelopes for putting the names of those you would like to be prayed for will be available from this weekend, and will be placed in a basket in front of the altar at every Mass.

The Blessing of Graves will take place on Sunday 10th November at 2pm, at the various cemeteries around Brighton and Hove. More details next weekend.

In addition we will have a special parish Mass for the Deceased at the 7pm Mass on Wednesday 27th November at St Theresa's. We will remember in particular those who have died in the past year. If there is anyone who has died in the last year, either a parishioner or a relative, that you would like to be remembered, please contact the parish office.

South Sudan gained independence in 2011 and has since struggled with economic, political, and social instability. UNICEF estimated in August 2023 that 1.4 million children under the age of five were suffering from acute malnutrition, and 7.1 million people currently face severe food insecurity. The conflict and migration of displaced people from Sudan since April 2023 has only exacerbated the already dire situation. The SVDP South Sudan have been working tirelessly to continue to provide hope and assistance to those most in need. Projects include, Infant Feeding, St Vincent's Healthcare Centre, St Vincent's School, Be in Hope home for homeless young boys, support for Internally Displaced Persons, Vocational Training opportunities, and more.
