Canon Colin Writes:

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near". Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath, signifying a shift in the Advent season from a focus on penance to a joyful anticipation of Christmas, with the rose colour representing this change from the usual purple of Advent which symbolizes reflection and preparation.

The prophet Zephaniah says, "Rejoice and exalt with all your heart". St Paul writing to the Philippians says "Brothers and Sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice". The scriptures couldn't be clearer we are called to bring joy and hope to our troubled world.

As Christmas approaches, the Church reminds us of the joy which should be in our hearts as we reflect on what the birth of the Christ child means for us, and we are called to share that message with all whom we meet. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing near when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead us into His kingdom. May our prayer be Come, Lord Jesus.
