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In some communities the Gospel of the Samaritan Women may be read as part of the first scrutiny for those to be baptised at Easter. Hearing that Gospel they are invited to believe in Jesus as the 'living water' and they are presented with the Creed. This ritual can inspire all of us as we journey through Lent to Easter.

In other communities of faith we will hear the Gospel of Luke where people have been disturbed by some difficult and troubling events; the cruelty and disrespect of authorities and a serious accident. As the story of the Galileans, whose blood Pilate had spilt, was told to Jesus he saw the assumption being made. What had those Galileans done to deserve that treatment? He answers; they were no worse than you.

Sometimes there is not a ready explanation for the difficult and hard events of life. We know we should not blame the victims but in some cases we are tempted to think that they might have done something to avoid their misfortune. Maybe, but maybe not, we often don't know and perhaps we would not have fared any better given the same circumstances.

Jesus is asking us not to give him, or others, a running commentary on what we think is fair or unfair, right or wrong and so on...but to produce good fruit in our own lives. He gives us the grace and the time to produce good fruit: "Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig round it and put on manure." This good fruit could be the mercy and compassion for those, and their families, who have been visited by misfortune.

Catholic Social Teaching refers to this compassion as solidarity, which is a rather clumsy word and has certain historical resonances. However this principle of the Social Teaching of the Church recognises the interdependence between people and the social nature of the human person together with their equality in dignity and rights. A timely reminder that our Lenten journey is not just an individual one but also one that has at its heart concern for our brothers and sisters.
