Canon Colin Writes:

Last Monday was the 80th anniversary of the liberation of
The Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration/extermination camp. Over the
years I have visited Auschwitz several times. It is a chilling experience;
from the moment you walk through the gate with the sign above
Arbeit macht frei (Work Sets You Free) you are faced with the horror
of the Nazi regime. The old barracks house, the museum with piles of
suit cases, shoes, spectacles and human hair. You then come to the
punishment cells where St. Maximilian Kolbe died. By the time that
you enter the gas chamber your emotions are numb.

I paraphrase Pastor Martin Niemoller's poem, a version is in the museum: -

When they came for the Gypsies, I said nothing because I wasn't a Gypsy;

When they came for the Poles, I said nothing because I wasn't a Pole; When they came for the Jews, I said nothing because I wasn't a Jew; When they came for me, there was no one left to speak up for me.

If good people remain silent or inactive in the face of injustice, evil will have the opportunity to thrive and spread unchecked.
