Canon Colin Writes:

Traditionally the final two weeks of Lent, in the Roman Rite, are used as an immediate preparation for the sorrowful events of the Easter drama. It is a period of time to focus more and more on the Passion and death of Jesus and so accompany him on his way to Calvary.

For several centuries the Fifth Sunday of Lent was known as "Passion Sunday" and marked the beginning of a special sub-season called Passiontide, which extended up until Holy Saturday. During this time the Church's liturgy became more sombre and a sorrowful mood was reflected in the various practices that occurred in the liturgy. Palm Sunday was seen as the "Second Sunday in Passiontide," After Vatican II, the Church decided to combine the two Sundays, removing Passion Sunday from the calendar and adding its name to Palm Sunday and is currently listed in the liturgical calendar as "Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion." After Palm Sunday, Passion Week gives way to Holy Week and the Church follows Jesus during his final days in Jerusalem.

The most obvious example of a more sombre mood was the veiling of statues and images, which remains an optional practice in the current Roman Missal. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the Easter Vigil begins.

St Peter's: Fridays at 7pm, during Lent.

St Theresa's & St George's: Fridays during lent. Alternating between

St George's (at 7:30pm) and St Theresa's (at 6:15pm).

Sacred Heart: Every Tuesday up to and including 15th April, the SH Prayer Group will lead the Stations of the Cross, immediately after the 10am Tuesday Mass. All are welcome to join.

St Mary Magdalen's after holy hour at 6:30pm on Fridays during Lent.

Lenten Holy Hour at St Peter's You are invited to spend time in prayer, face to face with Jesus in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: each Saturday in Lent from 5pm, concluding with Benediction at 5:45 (Mass at 6pm as usual). Jesus is really present in the consecrated host, which is displayed on the altar throughout this time. You can pray with Scripture, the rosary, or simply in your own words as you enjoy His presence. Please pray especially for the pastoral plan and for our collaboration with other communities of faith across Brighton & Hove. The time of prayer concludes with a special blessing called 'Benediction'. Times of Adoration in other Churches are in the newsletter and on their websites.


