Fr Tony writes:

This Thursday, 15th August, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Assumption** of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven, which is a Holyday of Obligation. The Wednesday evening Mass will be a vigil Mass of the Assumption. On Thursday and there will be a 10am Mass at St George's and also a 7pm Mass at St Theresa's.

The 15th of August was also the day that I was born in 1964, so Thursday is also my 60th birthday (which I find quite hard to believe!). I am fortunate that I was not named Assumpta. However, according to some sources, it is also the birthday of St Anthony. The Royal family will be celebrating, but mainly because it is also the birthday of Princess Anne.

The Assumption celebrates the truth that, at the end of her life, Mary was taken, body and soul, into heaven. Although it was only formally declared a doctrine of the Church in 1950, it has been celebrated since very early times. In the east it is referred to as the Dormition. It reminds us that there is one of us, Mary, who has fully completed the Christian journey. Where she has gone, we hope to follow.

Please pray for my Father, Michael Milner. On Monday he suffered a severe stroke. He survived and is conscious and alert, but is unable to speak and has lost movement on his right side. Please also pray for me and my family at this time. We were due to be going on holiday together this coming week! Bishop Richard Moth calls for a renewed openness to peace as UK protests continue

Addressing people of all faiths, and none, he highlighted the importance of 'reconciliation, understanding and a renewed openness to peace.' Violent anti-immigration protests have erupted across the UK, with demonstrations taking place in a number of towns and cities including Bristol, Leicester, London, Liverpool, Birmingham, Plymouth and Belfast.

The Catholic Church teaches that we are one human family, that every person is made in the image and likeness of God, and that all human life is sacred. Speaking on Tuesday, Bishop Richard said:

"The violent demonstrations we are witnessing at this time are a cause of immense distress and concern to us all. A violent approach will increase tension, fear and resentment for all in our communities, at a time when we should seek reconciliation and understanding. It is vitally important that we recognise the innate dignity and value of every human person. I call on all those within our Catholic family and beyond to pray for a rapid end to the present difficulties and a renewed openness and commitment to peace."
