Fr Tony Writes

I am writing this just as the final few results of the General Election are coming through. Whoever you voted for, and however you feel about the result, let us pray for the incoming government, that they may seek the Common Good, and that they may make wise choices in doing so. The challenges facing our country, and indeed our world, are huge. To face them effectively we need to move away from the politics of division, distrust and indeed fear, to a politics of respect, civility and co-operation. Of course there will be differences of opinion. But the more we recognise that we all face similar challenges, not just in our country but globally, the more we understand our common humanity, the better chance we have of working together to make a real difference.

This week I am off on my annual retreat. I will be at St Beuno's, the Jesuit retreat house in North Wales. Priests are expected to make an annual retreat, partly because if we do not attend to our own spiritual lives we are not going to be much use in helping others to grow in prayer and love of God. This weekend readings present us with two barriers to our being effective disciples in our world. In the Gospel people reject Jesus because they place limits on him based on his background. We should not let the opinion of others prevent us from following God's call for us.

St Paul, on the other hand, struggles with some unknown weakness, which he refers to as a 'thorn in the flesh'. We do not know what Paul's difficulty was. But when we are discouraged by our own weakness, our own sense of inadequacy to whatever we are called to or must face up to, we need to hear the words of the Lord spoken to Paul, "My grace is enough for you". In fact, because our weaknesses remind us that we are not self sufficient, causing us to look for help from God and others, they actually lead us to a much richer life where, in communion with God and one another, we can come to pray with St Paul:

Glory be to him, whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.

This was the prayer on my ordination prayer card. I will be celebrating my 31st anniversary of ordination while I am away (on July 16th). Do remember me in your prayers, as I will pray for all of you while on retreat.

Children in year 3 or above are eligible to make their First Holy Communion. Again, preparation will be offered by Sacred Heart and ourselves, with the First Holy Communion celebration taking place at the church normally attended by the family. There may also be a course offered at St Peter's if numbers demand. We will be providing application forms before the summer break so we can plan effectively for the year to come.

Confirmation

Confirmation is offered to those young people in secondary school who are ready to make a personal commitment to Christ and the Church in their life of faith: to *confirm* for themselves the commitment made at their baptism by their families, and have that *confirmed* by the Church. Sacred Heart will continue to run the preparation course for our churches. Candidates will also be expected to get involved in some way in their local church. Contact Fr Tony for more details.
