Canon David Writes

I came across an article from a good few years ago highlighting a dimension of the temptation of Christ it was called *Not giving up too easily: Thoughts for Ash Wednesday* from a Jesuit priest called Fr. Philip Endean, who wrote much throughout his life. His sister lived in a former parish of mine.

In this article, Fr. Endean writes: "When Matthew and Luke in their different ways name the temptations Jesus faces, it seems as though Jesus himself is growing into, being stretched towards, the full reality of his mission. He has to recognise that his was not that of simple miracle-working, despite the triumphs with which his career in the gospel seems to open. He has to realise that his kingdom is a kingdom in the truest sense, a kingdom from above, and therefore not of this world (John 18: 36-37). Jesus is not proving his moral fibre, but growing in his sense of his own identity." Perhaps we can see that our temptations are an invitation to grow into Christian maturity – the person that God created me to be.

This is also something important for young people and our relationship to them, we should recognise their need to grow in Christian identity and vocation in Christ. Jesus is with us in our wilderness, supporting us in our temptations. Post Easter maybe he is inviting us to assist one another in whatever ways we can to leave the wilderness and grow into the mission he has given us. Our Catholic communities and schools do that role and do it well, despite our limited resources Praying about how we help and respond to our own and other peoples' needs and especially those of young people's aspirations and concerns, would be a good spiritual exercise for Lent, including prayer, acts of reconciliation and hope.

Lenten Holy Hour at St Peter's

You are invited to spend time in prayer, face to face with Jesus in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: each Saturday (beginning 8th March) in Lent from 5pm, concluding with Benediction at 5:45 (Mass at 6pm as usual). Jesus is really present in the consecrated host, which is displayed on the altar throughout this time. You can pray with Scripture, the rosary, or simply in your own words as you enjoy His presence. Please pray especially for the pastoral plan and for our collaboration with other communities of faith across Brighton & Hove. The time of prayer concludes with a special blessing called 'Benediction'. Times of Adoration in other Churches are in the newsletter and on their websites.
